HUHS provides quality, flexible undergraduate, graduate, doctoral degree, and credit-bearing non-degree programs. All programs are focused on nutrition and related health sciences with a concentration in integrative healthcare. The University's online format is flexible, convenient, and affordable. HUHS is the first nutrition distance education university to attain national accreditation by the DEAC.

HUHS evaluates several factors of student achievement by monitoring outcome performance measures, which include graduation rates, retention rates for all programs, and professional licensure completion rates. Student success indicators document that HUHS students achieved their learning goals, were highly satisfied with their program, and would recommend the University to friends.
